

Degree in Modern Languages

Why choose it?

Modern languages are those that are used today, as opposed to the classical languages used in the Ancient World (eg Latin, Classical Greek) English is the most widely spoken language in the world by a growing number of speakers. It is, also, in many areas, the *lingua franca par excellence*. French is also one of the most commonly used languages worldwide. It is an official language in 29 countries in Europe, Africa and America, and the second most spoken language by non-native speakers in Europe. Chinese, the most spoken language in the world by native speakers, is the official language of the People's Republic of China, the most populated country in the world.

What can you use it for?

You will be trained to acquire a solid knowledge of two modern languages (English as the major, and French or Chinese the minor), plus you will gain a working knowledge of a third foreign language, and be able to participate in projects associated with the relevance of languages, cultures and literature. You will also increase your ability to establish relationships between literary and audiovisual texts with discourses of a very varied nature.

Can I have an international CV?

You will be able to participate in national and international mobility programmes, some of which are exclusive to the ULPGC, and which will further improve your training and your language competences. In addition to those languages offered in the degree plan of studies, you will be able to access a range of resources for language learning through the ULPGC Language Institute ('Aula de Idiomas') and the CRAAL self-learning resource platform (this is free of charge).
